Remembering Peter Mills



It was Peter's wishes that those thinking of giving flowers would consider making a donation to Age Concern Epsom & Ewell instead. These donations in memory of Peter Mills totalled £1035

Peter Mills was introduced to ACEE Mens Group by his daughter Sue who felt it important her father kept in touch with communal activities in his later years and make new friends. Sue recalled that at first Peter wasn't so keen on the idea but came to a group games event and soon found the camaraderie amongst the members compelling and quickly joined in and looked forward to planned gatherings on the ACEE timetable. Peter opened his home to host 'Mexican Train' meetings approximately once monthly and Sue laid on on teas and snacks which always proved popular:- the group was designed around member interests. Peter had mobility difficulties and members gave support with transport so he was able to attend a variety of community events. Peter was of a cheerful disposition and enjoyed recalling stories of his exploits on his boat on the Thames, his work as a building manager for the local Council and flying light aircraft to name but a few. Bonds built between his close family and ACEE created an inclusive and comfortable environment Peter liked and so often family parties extended invitations to group members. Unfortunately covid, in an untimely way, halted ACEE meetings when Peter sadly passed away in his mid nineties just as activities were ongoing again. Peter's life was celebrated at a fund raising event for Age Concern held at Sue's home in the Summer and he is warmly remembered and touched by all who knew him.








On Saturday 25th June Peter's daughter, Sue, and her family organised a fundraising garden tea party in memory of Peter.

There is a saying that everyone has a book in them. We were impressed to hear that one of our clients released theirs ...


It's not every day you meet someone that's had a book published but one of our clients, Philip Lovel, had decided to pen a novel in his 70s! We thought we'd share some of this information with our readers just in case we have any aspiring novelist out there.

We asked Philip how he developed a taste for writing...

"I suppose a liking for writing has grown in recent years as a hobby, because at school and in my younger days such a thing didn't particularly interest me. But my former occupation – police officer- demanded it.

Since retirement I decided to have a go at fiction writing, mainly, I suppose because my mother wrote poetry but also to prove I could do it. I started writing in about 2013 in my 70s and the book was published in February this year. I decided to write detective fiction for obvious reasons and the book is set in Great Malvern in Worcestershire. I didn't serve there, I was in the Met, but even if people don't know Malvern they hopefully will still enjoy the book.

I'm in the process of writing a second novel again set in Malvern, also detective fiction. The first novel was partially funded by a contribution from me, so it's a sort of hybrid selfpublishing.



I didn't knock on any publishers' doors but simply took the plunge and selected a lesser known company from the web. To attract the interest of what I would call a traditional publisher these days requires the services of a literary agent, as they won't accept unsolicited manuscripts; whereas my publisher did and a very good job they did too. Regarding starting out, I think persistence is the name of the game."

IT HAPPENED BETWEEN 6-7PM ON SATURDAY 18TH JUNE IN EPSOM, SURREY. THE DAUGHTER GOT A PHONE CALL FROM HER MOTHER ASKING IF ANY ONE OF THE FAMILY COULD GO ROUND TO HOLD HER HAND BECAUSE THE POLICE WERE COMING ANY MINUTE TO COLLECT HER BANK CARDS AND ALL HER CASH. THEY HAD CALLED HER ON THE PHONE TALKING TO HER FOR AN HOUR. THE PERSON WAS 'PC SMITH' TO SAY THAT SOMEONE HAD CLONED HER CARD AND WITHDRAWN £250. THEY GAVE HER A NUMBER FOR LLOYDS BANK TO REPORT IT, WHICH SHE DID, AND THE BANK SAID THEY WOULD GIVE HER THE £250 BACK AND WOULD CANCEL HER CARDS. THEY ALSO ASKED HER TO READ OUT ALL OF HER LATEST TRANSACTIONS. SHE TOTALLY BELIEVED THEM. THANK GOODNESS SHE MESSAGED HER DAUGHTER WHO SAW THE MESSAGE AND ACTED IMMEDIATELY.

AS SOON AS THE DAUGHTER RECEIVED HER MESSAGE SHE TRIED RINGING BUT THE SCAMMERS WERE STILL KEEPING THE LINE OPEN EVEN THOUGH SHE SAID SHE WASN'T TALKING TO ANYONE. THE DAUGHTERS HUSBAND WENT STRAIGHT AROUND TO HER FLAT AND THE DAUGHTER CALLED 999. WHEN THE HUSBAND ARRIVED HE FOUND HIS MOTHER-IN-LAW LOOKING FOR A MAT WHEN ASKED WHY SHE TOLD HIM "THEY ASKED ME TO PUT MY CASH AND CARDS IN AN ENVELOPE AND PUT THEM UNDERNEATH A DOORMAT FOR COLLECTION." THE SCAMMERS CALLED AGAIN AND THE MUM PASSED THE PHONE TO THE HUSBAND THE SCAMMERS RANG OFF STRAIGHT AWAY.

THE WHOLE THING WAS VERY CONVINCING AND THE MUM WAS TOTALLY TAKEN IN.
THEY DIDN'T TAKE THE CARD NUMBERS OVER THE PHONE OR THE CCV BUT SHE
GAVE THEM HER PIN NUMBERS. THEY WOULD HAVE COLLECTED THE CARDS AND
EMPTIED HER ACCOUNTS.

THE POLICE DID ATTEND AND HAVE TOLD THE FAMILY THAT THE CRIMINALS NEVER PICK UP THE CARDS THEMSELVES BUT USE COURIERS, SO IT'S VERY DIFFICULT TO CATCH THEM.

PLEASE SHARE AND WARN VULNERABLE FRIENDS, RELATIVES AND NEIGHBOURS.
